"When Will He Come?"


People today spend money on alarms for their homes and cars. What will happen to those things we treasure is uncertain. We try to protect ourselves and our things. We do not know if or when someone will try to break in and rob us. Certainly if we did know, we would be ready, even more prepared.

In the story Jesus tells, the master goes away and leaves his servants to do what they should. They do not know when he will return. Some servants do what is right, will be ready for their master, and will be rewarded. Some servants get tired of waiting or are lazy and do not want to do their part of the work. They are not ready for the master's return. Those servants will not be rewarded but will be punished.

One of the questions which this story can bring to our minds is the coming of Jesus at the end of time or at the moment of our death. No one knows when the end of the world will come. Some people look at the present natural and human events and say the end of the world is coming soon.

I think of this time last year and I, like many other people, had no idea someone I loved would be dead before the end of that year. If we think about it, there are people both famous and those we loved in our daily personal lives who are now dead. What does that say about our own death? We do not know the day or the hour. Like the servants, we are called to prepare, to be faithful, and to do God's will. We are called to live each day in God's presence, living our lives doing His will and loving each other. Faith-ful-ness calls us to prepare and be ready.

NOTICE: ISSUANCE OF **NEW PARKING PERMITS FOR CHURCH LOT**
