From the Desk of Fr. Francis

Greetings of Christ's Peace and Joy! Hope you all had a blessed week.

"I Have Been Mercifully Treated"

Paul admits that he was a sinner but God gave him the grace to be a minister of Jesus Christ. God is merciful to him even when he was arrogant. He experienced forgiveness because of God's unfathomable mercy.

Forgiveness is the theme of today's Gospel. Luke is convinced that anyone who is willing to repent of his/her sins can be assured of God's forgiveness. He uses three parables of "lost and found" to make his point.

The parables of the sheep and the coin symbolize the loss of sinners. Luke's teaching is that there is more joy in heaven and among angels over one sinner who repents than over many who do not. However, I think that the focus here is on the shepherd and the woman as metaphors for God, who is depicted as extremely assertive in finding what was lost. This is how much God loves us.

The third parable uses the same dynamic as the previous ones. After the younger son squandered his inheritance and brought monumental shame upon himself and his family, he returns home out of desperation. His father treats him like royalty with no questions asked. Again, this shows God's mercy and love for us.

We face similar situations in our own lives. Oftentimes, we find ourselves in need of God's mercy and forgiveness. Our openness and acceptance of them empower us to share that mercy with others. Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta once said: "Bringing joy to one unhappy person is worth everything." Similarly, today's readings remind us that bringing mercy to one lost person is worth everything. God is never tired of granting mercy and forgiveness to us. We need to do that for one another.

As we continue the Year of Mercy, let's strive to deepen our faith in our loving God, who is rich in mercy and forgiveness. In times of lost as the sheep, the coins, and the prodigal son, we can be assured of God's mercy and love. The Good News is that no matter what our situation in life may be, God's mercy is always available for us.

Today we also celebrate the Annual SMI Feast; we extend our warm welcome to all of our visitors and friends. We have another great opportunity to share our joy, faith, and mercy with our neighbors and visitors.


Have you ever lost your keys? Even in your own home or in your work place it is very easy to misplace things. A person can spend many hours searching for these important items. Frustration comes easily when you keep losing the same thing over and over. Sometimes we see signs on posts in the neighborhood where an owner is looking for a lost cat or dog. Sadness can fill the family who has lost their pet.

When we are living our lives with deliberate actions against God's laws or acting in evil or hurtful ways toward others we are turning away from God and His care for us. We are in a sense, lost. With the help of God's Grace, we can turn back to God. All the time, God is waiting for us, seeking us, searching for us like the lost sheep in the Gospel. We are like the son who left home and finally returned.

When we find our lost keys or pet or other lost objects we are very relieved and very happy. Our Gospel stories today tell of losing and finding. Jesus is spoken of as one who "welcomes sinners and eats with them." When we are sinners we are lost. When the shepherd finds his lost sheep that he searches for, he is happy and asks others to celebrate his joy. When the woman finds her lost coin, she tells others to "Rejoice with me because I have found the coin that I lost." When the son returns to his father his father is so happy he throws a party and gives him new clothes and a ring. The father is filled with joy and gladness. He celebrates "for my son who was lost is found."

When we receive the sacrament of Reconciliation we return to God. When we ask God's forgiveness we return to God and are one with Him. We are welcomed back. God rejoices with great
gladness. The whole Church celebrates though the sacraments. God calls to us. "Come back to
me with all your heart." What is keeping you from God? Give God GREAT JOY! What are you waiting for? Do it NOW! "Sister Caritas"



RESPECT LIFE CORNER

The USCCB developed "The Life and Dignity of the Human Person" priority plan for 2010-2012. Its message is still true today and we should all take to heart the principles promoted in it. Each of us should participate in the education, prayer and advocacy efforts that our parishes offer.

Human Life and Dignity

For the Church, there is no distinction between defending human life and promoting the dignity of the human person.

Pope Benedict XVI writes in <u>Caritas in Veritate</u>. . . that "The Church forcefully maintains this link between life ethics and social ethics, fully aware that 'a society lacks solid foundations when, on the one hand, it asserts values such as the dignity of the person, justice and peace, but then, on the other hand, radically acts to the contrary by allowing or tolerating a variety of ways in which human life is devalued and violated, especially where it is weak or marginalized." (no. 15).

As a gift from God, every human life is sacred from conception to natural death.

As a gift from God, every human life is sacred from conception to natural death. The life and dignity of every person must be respected and protected at every stage and in every condition. The right to life is the first and most fundamental principle of human rights that leads Catholics to actively work for a world of greater respect for human life and greater commitment to justice and peace.

The bishops pledged to affirm the intrinsic value of human life and the dignity of every human being in a way that transforms the culture by implementing "The Life and Dignity of the Human Person" priority plan for 2010-2012.

To achieve this goal, the priority plan includes ongoing education, prayer, policy, and advocacy efforts to mobilize the Catholic community on issues of life, justice, and peace. In this way, the Catholic community celebrates the gift of human life and witnesses to the Good News of Jesus Christ.
