Our visit to the Shrine of Our Lady of La Salette, located in Twin Lakes Wisconsin, offers a day-long pilgrimage of peace and reflection.

The outdoor Shrine is a replica of the site of the apparition in France with seating for outdoor liturgies. Located close by are shrines that commemorate the apparitions of the Mother God, inviting us to ponder on the messages she gave to the visionaries.

The La Salette Missionaries minister in 23 countries around the world; they are best known for their compassion, willingness to listen and understand. In this fast-paced world, they provide a vital role someone for a troubled person to talk to.

La Salette (La-sa-let) French words meaning "the little room", is also the name of a little French village nestled in the Alps where an extraordinary occurrence took place near the village on September 19, 1846.

Today, it is the site of a shrine built to celebrate an appearance of the Mother of Jesus to two children. It is holy ground for the Mother of God came to this remote area to invite all her children to the reconciling love of her Son, Jesus. It is a place of faith and prayer, a place of prophetic challenge to our time, a place of pilgrimage.

"Whom Do You Believe?"

We are hearing and seeing all kinds of statements about the candidates running for president. They say many things about each other. Whom do you believe? Our world today is filled with e-mails, Facebook, and texting, etc. We are bombarded with messages, ideas and words. Not all of the things written and said are completely true or even partial true.

In the time of Jesus, those who were poor were set apart in that society and consider cursed by God. Because of their poverty, even if things changed for them, groups in that time would never accept them into another place in society. Jesus saw this and identified Himself with the poor and the outcast. In our Gospel today Jesus tells the Pharisees and us a story.

Lazarus, in the story is poor and a beggar who is ignored by a "rich man." Jesus does not give the "rich man" a name but the beggar is dignified by Jesus by having a name. Both die and Lazarus is rewarded. The "rich man" is punished and pleads that his brothers would be warned to change. He admits that they would not pay attention to Moses' directives, the Ten Commandments. Abraham, whom he is having the conversation with, tells him if they will not believe Moses and the prophet, "neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead" and warn them. Who do you believe? Jesus tells us how we are to live. We too have the commandments and Jesus' teaching about how we are to treat others. Do we do what we have been taught or will we be like the "rich man" and his family? We need to look at our lives. What will we do?

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Last year, in speaking to a conference in Rome, Pope Francis reminded the participants that "the vocation to the priesthood is a gift that God gives to some for the good of all." This weekend as we celebrate and pray for our own seminarians in the Archdiocese of Chicago, I ask you once again for your financial support of them.

We currently have sixty-seven seminarians preparing for a life of service as your future pastors. Their motivation and enthusiasm for serving in the Church through a life-long commitment is inspiring to us all, promoting us to offer in return our prayers, fraternal encouragement and financial support. Many of you have personally told me how much you enjoy meeting our seminarians whenever they visit parishes and I know you come away from those experiences with a renewed sense of hope for the future.

We in turn as a community need to stand with them during their years of preparation and for this reason I invite you to join with me in making this year's seminarian collection a great success. Contributions made to this collection alleviate monthly expenses such as tuition and fees (\$1,850), room and board (\$950), formation programs (\$250), and health insurance (\$190) for each seminarian and will be used solely for the formation of new priests for the Archdiocese of Chicago. You may make a one-time donation no less than your weekly contribution to your parish, or establish a monthly contribution to the collection. Your gift, whatever the amount, will have a great impact on our seminarians, as they see first-hand your willingness to stand in solidarity with them.

During the *Renew My Church* consultation, one of the top priorities identified was the need to promote vocations to the priesthood. We are doing everything possible in this regard, but I do need your support through prayer and donations to the seminarian collection.

Thank you for your commitment to our seminarians. You can rely on me joining you in prayer for them as well as my remembrance of your needs as I thank God for your many gifts.
