
"Following JESUS"

Who is Onesimus? Paul, in the second reading today, writes about Onesimus. He was a slave of Philemon, a leading Christian in Colossae. He ran away and met Paul and was baptized. He became a friend of Paul or as Paul says, "a son." Whatever the circumstances of Onesimus' running way, Paul asks that he be taken back not as a slave but as a brother, a Christian believer equal to any of the Christians in the community. Paul even is willing to pay any debts owed by Onesimus. In his writing today Paul delicately and directly asks for Onesimus' acceptance as a member of the Christian Community, not as a slave.

Sometimes in families there are situations where one member is not willing to speak to or relate to another member. Both may be Catholic, have had a strong relationship in the past, but now they have not spoken to each other in years. There is a separation of the whole family sometimes. People may not even remember exactly what happened to bring this situation about. How can this be resolved? Someone must find a common value or common need and lead the process of forgiveness as Paul did. Someone must make the first move. Onesimus became a saint and leader in the community.

When we are baptized, we are taken into the community, the family of God, the Catholic Church. We become adopted children of God. Jesus, through His suffering, death, and resurrection, has paid the price of our adoption and salvation. Can we do what Onesimus did? Can we become such complete followers of Jesus living in such a way that nothing keeps us from following Jesus? Can we become saints? The grace of God is powerful enough to make this possible. We must only embrace God's grace and faithfully follow Jesus who has lovingly paid the price of our salvation.

Radical Discipleship

This week's gospel may be hard to hear, but it does contains a core message pertaining to our ongoing conversation on missionary discipleship.

Radical is the best word to describe how Jesus understands the conditions of discipleship. An intentional disciple may be called to make choices which family members either don't understand or are unable to fully appreciate.

Recently a friend shared her earlier struggle to join the RCIA from a few years back. My friend's parents, you see, are Buddhist and consequently reacted very negatively toward her interest in Catholic baptism.

"Will this choice of yours to become Catholic end up in you breaking from our family's traditions?" they expressed in dismay.

"I sincerely did not believe that they think they would ever come to the Easter Vigil to accompany me during my Christian initiation. I was surprised and very pleased when mom and dad showed up!" she recounted with joy

Adult converts to the Catholic faith who come through the RCIA are often blessed with similar 'radical' moments of grace in their narratives. Please feel free to take some RCIA literature with you on your way out of church today.

RESPECT LIFE CORNER

Sept. 9 Day of Prayer for Peace in Our Communities

"Some of you said: this system can no longer be endured. We must change it; we must put human dignity again at the center and on that pillar build the alternative social structures we need. It must be done with courage, but also with intelligence, with tenacity but without fanaticism, with passion but without violence. And among us all, addressing the conflicts without being trapped in them, always seeking to resolve the tensions to reach a higher plane of unity, peace and justice." -- Pope Francis, 10/28/14

On July 8, in his initial and immediate response to the racially-related shootings in Baton Rouge, Minneapolis and Dallas, Archbishop Joseph E. Kurtz of Louisville, Kentucky, noted the need to look at ways the Catholic Church can walk with and help these suffering communities. The initiatives announced today begin to address that need.

"I have stressed the need to look toward additional ways of nurturing an open, honest and civil dialogue on issues of race relations, restorative justice, mental health, economic opportunity, and addressing the question of pervasive gun violence," Archbishop Kurtz said. "The Day of Prayer and special Task Force will help us advance in that direction. By stepping forward to embrace the suffering, through unified, concrete action animated by the love of Christ, we hope to nurture peace and build bridges of communication and mutual aid in our own communities."

The Day of Prayer for Peace in Our Communities will be celebrated on the feast of St. Peter Claver, September 9, and will serve as a focal point for the work of the task force.

The purpose of the Task Force is to help bishops engage the challenging problems directly, by various means: gathering and disseminating supportive resources and "best practices"; actively listening to the concerns of members in troubled communities and law enforcement; and building strong relationships to help prevent and resolve conflicts. The Task Force will conclude its work with a report on its activities and recommendations for future work to the November General Assembly.

Archbishop Wilton D. Gregory of Atlanta, former USCCB president, will chair the task force.
