Pope Francis' Lenten Message

As the season of Lent continues to unfold, Pope Francis reminds us that the Word is a gift and the other person is a gift too. He is calling all Christians to deepen our appreciation for the Word and for other people in this Lent. He wrote:

Lent is a new beginning, a path leading to the certain goal of Easter, Christ's victory over death. This season urgently calls us to conversion. Christians are asked to return to God "with all their hearts" (Joel 2:12), to refuse to settle for mediocrity and to grow in friendship with the Lord. Jesus is the faithful friend who never abandons us. Even when we sin, he patiently awaits our return; by that patient expectation, he shows us his readiness to forgive (cf. Homily, 8 January 2016).

Lent is a favorable season for deepening our spiritual life through the means of sanctification offered us by the Church: fasting, prayer and almsgiving. At the basis of everything is the word of God, which during this season we are invited to hear and ponder more deeply. I would now like to consider the parable of the rich man and Lazarus (cf. Lk 16:19-31). Let us find inspiration in this meaningful story, for it provides a key to understanding what we need to do in order to attain true happiness and eternal life. It exhorts us to sincere conversion.

Our parish provides many opportunities for spiritual renewal in this Lent. I invite you to participate as often as possible. Conversion needs our willingness to change and to make the efforts. If we do so, God's grace would be able to work miracles in our lives.

Lenten Regulations (from March 1st, 2017, Ash Wednesday, to the Paschal Triduum)



Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

RESTORE THE CHURCH BUILD THE FUTURE



Dear Father,

Each year, the Collection for the Church in Central and
Eastern Europe (CCEE) assists Catholics, many of whom live
in countries once dominated by the Soviet regime, with rebuilding their communities. This important
collection supports 28 countries in a myriad of ways, from providing funds to rebuild church structures
to supporting programs that lift up the dignity of the marginalized to offering scholarships that reinforce
the intellectual life of the Church. By taking up this collection at Mass, you help to build the future for
the faithful in this region.

After the fall of communism in Romania, virtually none of the Greek Catholic churches that were confiscated by the communist regime were recovered. As a symbol of the sacrifice of their ancestors, the Eparchy of Cluj-Gherla began construction of the Cathedral of the Martyrs and Confessors of the Twentieth Century in the city of Cluj-Napoca in 1992. With the support of your parishioners to the Collection for CCEE, the cathedral is on target to be completed in 2018. It will serve as a place of prayer but also as a location for pastoral care, hosting a library, conference hall, and activities for children and youth, as well as an exhibition of the history of the eparchy. Your support of this collection is providing a place of prayer, gathering, and learning for the people of this eparchy.

The most effective thing you can do to promote the collection is to mention it at Mass. Tell the story of the cathedral in Cluj-Napoca, and use the parish appeal and bulletin announcement found inside this mailer. 



'Listen to Him"

We live in a time of many voices, especially now. We have to distinguish who is speaking the truth and who is making things up for excitement or confusion sake. Each of us has our framework of truth and our moral compass based on beliefs which guide us as we seek the truth. Sometimes there is an author whose writings encourage us. Sometimes there is a speaker, theologian or preacher whose words and teachings enliven our faith. We want to listen.

The Gospel today gives us a very clear directive from God the Father. He proclaims that He is very pleased with His Son. He then simply tells the apostles and through them, us, "Listen to Him." Jesus is His perfectly spoken Word. Jesus reveals God the Father to us by what He does and what He says.

There are many different levels of listening which we as human beings are capable of. We can just hear sounds but not really understand or pay attention to what the sounds mean. We can listen to words and connect to the meaning of what is being said but meet the message of the speaker with resistance. We do not want the message of the speaker to be a part of ourselves or our lives. We can listen with complete openness of heart and allow the message given to enter our very being and we can open ourselves to the message and act on it in our everyday lives. No doubt, this latter way of listening is what God the Father is asking of us when He tells us to "Listen to Him." He asks us to be open to the message, words and actions of Jesus. He wants us to listen so deeply that we are transformed and witness who Jesus is through our daily lives. God asks us to allow the Word, who is Jesus, to completely take over our lives, to live in our hearts daily. If God, the Father looks at us, will He see our listening heart? Will He say of us what He did of His Son, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased?"
