Easter Sunday 2017

Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Risen Lord,

This year's Easter gospel comes to us from Saint Matthew. He describes Easter morning. Women go to the tomb at dawn on the first day of the week. An angel appears and speaks to them: "Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples."

In these words, we find the essential Easter message directed to each one of us today in our uncertain world and amid the painful burdens we carry: **do not be afraid**, **come and see**, **go and tell**.

Easter eases our fear when we come to know God's triumph in the resurrection of Jesus. Easter invites us to come and see with fresh eyes what God has done in conquering sin and death. Easter summons us to go and share our faith and hope with others.

When we hear this message and recognize Jesus Christ as the Risen Lord of life, how can we not praise and thank God? How can we not walk together with new confidence and hope? In a time when violence and death-dealing forces seem rampant in the world and even in our own neighborhoods, we truly need new confidence and hope. And when we listen to the Lord, as we have been trying to do in the Archdiocese of Chicago, to seek directions for the renewal of our local Church, we surely need new confidence and hope.

Pray with me that we may all truly hear the words—do not be afraid, come and see, go and tell—and so draw new life from them for our loved ones, our world, our city and metropolitan area, our Church, and our very selves.



### "EASTER 2017"

As we come to Church today we see blooming trees. Daffodils are in full bloom with their brilliant yellow color. Other spring flowers are open and tulips are about to show their reds, yellow and white colors. Everything which has been waiting for this season, is starting to come to life. The special green of the grass at this time is unlike the color any other time of year. Everywhere we have signs of new life, renewed life. Saturday evening fifteen of our members participated in the Mass receiving the fullness of the Sacraments of Initiation. Truly our Church is filled with new life. We still have children receiving their Frist Communion and young people receiving Confirmation.

Today we celebrate Easter. It was first experienced by the Apostles, disciples, and the women, over two thousand years ago. Our Gospel stories about Easter are filled with rolled back stone, angels, sleeping guards, burial cloths lying in different places, and Jesus is not in the tomb. He appears to Mary Magdalen, to the eleven apostles, and others, such as the two men on the way to Emmaus. He comes into locked rooms, meets Mary in the burial garden, when Peter and the others go fishing. No doubt not all the stories are recorded.

What does it all mean? As He said He would, Jesus came back to life. He is Alive. He has overcome death and will never die again. His body has the marks of the nails and the wound in His side. His body is different, no longer limited by time and space. Human limitations are gone. Eventually Jesus goes back to God the Father, body, soul, and divinity.

What is our relationship to this mystery? For one thing we share, through the grace of Baptism, in Jesus fullness of life. The Jesus we receive in Holy Communion is the Risen Jesus, completely alive... In this mystery of the Eucharist we are one with Him and with each other. Because of His death and resurrection we will have everlasting life like Jesus. We will be able to attain heaven through Jesus. We share in His joy.

### **Origin of Divine Mercy Sunday or The Feast of Mercy**

Mankind's need for the message of Divine Mercy took on dire urgency in the 20th Century, when civilization began to experience an "eclipse of the sense of God" and, therefore to lose the understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life. In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary.

On one occasion, I heard these words: My daughter, tell the whole world about My Inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day



all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy. (Diary 699)

Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to our neighbors always and everywhere. You must not shrink from this or try to absolve yourself from it. (Diary 742)

On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

Liturgically the Easter Octave has always been centered on the theme of Divine Mercy and forgiveness. Divine Mercy Sunday, therefore, points us to the merciful love of God that lies behind the whole Paschal Mystery — the whole mystery of the death, burial and resurrection of Christ — made present for us in the Eucharist. In this way, it also sums up the whole Easter Octave. As Pope John Paul II pointed out in his Regina Caeli address on Divine Mercy Sunday, 1995: "the whole octave of Easter is like a single day," and the Octave Sunday is meant to be the day of "thanksgiving for the goodness God has shown to man in the whole Easter mystery."
