From the Desk of Fr. Francis

Greetings of Christ's Peace and Joy! Hope you all had a blessed week.

Thanks to all who helped with the farewell luncheon for Ms. Cavallone last Sunday. It was a wonderful celebration of her many years of hard work at St. Therese. We wish her the best in her new position.

Thanks to members of our Young Adult Ministry for attending the first Theology-On-Tap for this Summer. Over 800 young adults gathered for some good music and beer. They were inspired by Fr. Rob Galea's vocation story. A talented songwriter and musician, Fr. Rob experienced conversion and



God's grace working miraculously in his life, partially because of the intercessory prayer of his mother. I include an excerpt of his story below for your reflection and inspiration, shared by Lori Haracek Chaplin.

A Mother's Prayer by Fr. Bob's Vocation Story

A mother named Anne Galea, her son, Rob, 17, had been out of control. She felt helpless watching him spiral downward. Unbeknown to Rob, she would stand outside his bedroom door and pray as she listened to him sob. Praying was all she could do for her son because he wouldn't let her help him.

One day, the pain she felt for her suffering son brought her to her knees. She cried out to God that she would not get up until he saved her son. She begged for mercy for Rob, beseeching the Blessed Mother to be her son's mother and to carry him to Jesus.

Through her tears, she beheld in her mind's eye a picture of Rob surrounded by a group of young people. In this vision, her son was playing a guitar and singing and around his neck was a priest's collar. Anne's son didn't sing or own a guitar, and for him to become a priest would be a miracle.

When Rob was 14, he wanted nothing to do with his parents, especially his father. He began sneaking out to clubs, drinking, smoking, lying, and shoplifting for an adrenaline high. Then he fell into the wrong crowd and started doing drugs. When he was 17, a malicious lie he told about a drug dealer put his life in danger, and he was afraid to leave his room.

He was in such a debilitated mental state that he would punch himself in the gut and hit his head against the wall to distract himself from thinking. Rob, consumed with worry and loneliness, felt hopeless. He thought no one cared — not realizing that his mother was begging for the Lord to save him.

A phone call from his surviving grandmother inviting Rob's sister, Rachel, to a Catholic youth group meeting was the lifeline that Rob needed. He asked his mom if he could go with his sister. At that meeting, he witnessed the happiness of people who loved Christ, and he wanted to experience their joy. The preacher had told the group that they could talk to Jesus. Rob grew up in a Catholic home, but he never felt that God had time for him.

Even so, what the preacher said caused him to do something unusual. He closed his bedroom door and set up two chairs facing each other. Rob sat in one chair and invited Jesus to sit in the other. Every day, he would talk to Jesus as if he was sitting in the chair across from him — praying and pouring out his problems.

Beyond Fr. Rob's exciting story, for me, one of the most important messages is for parents. For all of those moms and dads out there thinking that there is no hope for a seemingly lost child, this priest's story offers hope and encouragement. It reminds us never to stop praying for our children.

Stories from the Chinese Apostolate



Studies reveal that the most effective way for parishes to build next year's RCIA class is to leverage opportunities for former RCIA participants to go public with their faith. This does not mean standing on a street corner proselytizing, but rather doing simple acts of charity, like translating at the local the post office for immigrant families.

Irene Lee, baptized just a couple of years ago, joins Perry Lau, St. Therese RCIA instructor, at the Chinatown on Saturday's to translate.

"Many recent immigrants come into our local post

office without the necessary language skills to navigate our system here. Recently, for example, I helped a patron who was about to incorrectly put her mail in the garbage slot. I showed her the correct place to place her mail. She was so grateful that her important letter was going to safely arrive to her loved one in London."

This past Sunday Irene was delighted to see that one of the customers whom she had assisted actually came to the Sunday liturgy at St Therese. "I am so grateful for the Eucharist," Irene shared with Perry after mass, "because it helps me when I lose hope. It is easy for widows like me to lose hope. Thanks to Jesus in the bread and wine, I will never lose hope."

Stop Imposing Your Morality!

On Tuesday, the Supreme Court ruled 5-4 in NIFLA v Becerra that a California law requiring pro -life pregnancy centers to post information about state-sponsored abortion services was unconstitutional. In his concurring opinion, Justice Anthony Kennedy wrote that the law was an "example of the serious threat presented when government seeks to impose its own message in the place of individual speech, thought, and expression."

And that got me thinking about the common charge that Christians are always trying to "impose their morality" on other people.

This claim used to be made in the context of efforts to outlaw abortion or same-sex marriageefforts, by the way, that dealt with moral principles that can be known from reason, like the humanity of the unborn or the conjugal nature of marriage.

But as *NIFLA* showed, Christians are now in the position where the law is routinely used to impose moral assumptions not on unbelievers but on them. Even the refusal to act can now be considered an unjust "imposition" that requires legal punishment-like the sincere, conscientious refusal to bake a cake, take a picture, or even call someone by a certain name or pronoun.

Should tolerance and the desire not to "impose morality" extend to everyone?
