Rest

After the long Summer fair weekend, most of us felt tired and we needed a good rest. Similarly, today's Gospel speaks about the need for spiritual rest in our missionary work. After their successful mission trip, the disciples were invited to "come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while."

Last Sunday we heard how the disciples were called and sent out two by two to preach and heal. Today's Gospel focuses on what we can learn about Jesus, his disciples, and the people to whom they are ministering.

The ministry is a success. Mark tells us that the apostles gathered with Jesus and reported all they had done and taught. Their ministry has been a success and they appear excited to tell Jesus all about it. In Mark's Gospel the Galilean ministry of Jesus begins on a very positive note, but as it continues on serious challenge will emerge.

Rest is needed. The disciples have been fully engaged with their teaching and healing ministries. They were so busy that they didn't have time to eat. Jesus knows how hard they have been working and he was concerned of their well-being. So Jesus asked them to have a retreat.

The vast crowd is looking for Jesus. Getting away from the people proves to be a difficult task. They are hungry for what the disciples have been giving them, and they want more. Jesus saw their hunger and his heart was moved with pity and compassion for them. He began to teach them many things.

The experiences of the early apostles can be our experiences today. We too have success in our ministry; we too need rest for our spiritual well-being; and we too witness the hunger and thirst of our contemporaries. Rest and compassion can help us to become better disciples.

Respect Life Corner

Maggie's Story: Living Like Dad

A few weeks prior, Dad had suffered a severe fall that damaged his spinal cord and left him unable to move from his neck down. My formerly healthy and active father would no longer be doing much of anything for himself. His health was quickly failing due to his age and the stress the accident imposed on his system, and I realized we were entering a new phase of Dad's existence: the end of his life.

Watching anyone suffer, especially a loved one, is one of the hardest human experiences. Physical and emotional pain seep into us and affect us profoundly. For me, watching my father come to terms with his prognosis was agonizing. As time progressed, his condition deteriorated, bringing dementia, and later, the end stages leading to his death. "Why doesn't God just take him already?"

God loved us enough to allow those moments - even and especially moments of suffering. Dad left a legacy. He taught me how to live and die with faith and with dignity marked by patience and grace. He taught me that dignity can't be diminished by pain or loss of personal control. Regardless of our circumstances and whether people acknowledge it, nothing and no one can take away our God-given dignity.

I needed to know that message because my own life today is filled with chemo treatments, fatigue, and a gradual loss of physical function. I've been diagnosed with aggressive glioblastoma brain cancer.

My dad's legacy of faith and courage have been a beacon for me, lighting my path as I walk through the valley of the shadow of *my* own death. I know that in some states, I could legally seek to end my life with a lethal prescription. However, I also know that there is much more to my story, and many more people involved in it, than just myself. Assisted suicide wouldn't end suffering; it would increase it for those left behind. Assisted suicide also involves more than just the patient. It includes doctors, pharmacists, witnesses, and the state, which we trust to protect and safeguard the most vulnerable: people with disabilities, the elderly, people with mental illnesses, and others. When societies accept assisted suicide as a "quick fix" for terminally ill patients, they lose the incentive to improve genuine end-of-life care and pain control - or even to offer it to those who want it.

My brain cancer - or what I can or can't do - doesn't define me as a person. But it does give me the opportunity to witness to the fact that every human life has incredible dignity, whether we are infirm or able. And all the while, my family and friends can daily learn the valuable lessons of caring for me in my last days with real compassion and respect. Through their loving care, they affirm what I also know - that my life is, always has been, and always will be, worth living.

"BE GOOD SHEPHERDS" by Sister Caritas

One of the sayings I have heard said about the Marine Corp is that they never leave a Marine behind. If someone is injured in battle other Marines will risk their lives to get the wounded Marine and bring them back to safety. This is true even if they are killed. My Mother taught my brother and I something similar. We were never to come home without the other brother or sister we left with. This taught us to "look out" for each other.

Our readings today talk about being a shepherd. The shepherd is the one who cares for the sheep. The shepherd is the one who finds food for the sheep, keeps them safe and together. The people find out where Jesus and the Apostles are going and reached the location before Jesus gets there. Jesus sees the people and how they are yearning and looking for someone to be their shepherd.

Each of us is to be shepherd to others. In our families we are to care for each other. In our parish family we need to "look out" for each other not leave anyone alone or leave them behind. As we grow our Chinese Apostolate, we need to reach out to the immigrant new to our city. We need to help people feel welcome and at home. We need to be Good Shepherds, looking out for others. We imitate our loving God.
