

## **Stories from the Chinese Apostolate**



If you have been reading the stories from the Chinese Apostolate this summer, you might be wondering how it is connected to our RCIA.

The primary agenda of the Chinese Apostolate is not simply just about filling up RCIA seats in the fall, but rather providing parish members with creative opportunities to reach out to neighbors.

Recent Chinese immigrants are our neighbors.

The connection between the Chinese Apostolate and the RCIA, therefore, is more indirect than direct. Like the early Christians, who practiced acts of charity and social justice within their community, the Chinese Apostolate

indirectly attracts people to the faith through works rather than words.

While it would be wonderful if a robust group of immigrants joined our RCIA this fall, the Chinese Apostolate is not a means to an end. The Holy Spirit guides the growth our parish. All we have to do is cooperate with the Holy Spirit.

I suggest we reflect on the Chinese Apostolate as the biggest tree in our garden, firmly rooted by the Holy Spirit as our foundation. The RCIA, on the other hand, can be more likened to the fruits on our tree's branches. A good tree, with the help of rain and good weather, bears good fruit.

"Here I Am, Lord, is it I, Lord, I have heard you calling in the night." | 19 July 2018 Dear Friends,

I still remember vividly that inspiring song by Dan Schutte. Of course, I knew this song as a kid. I was a student at St. Therese School, and although I wasn't Catholic at the time, I looked forward to attending the school Mass. I was intrigued by the prayers, the rituals, and, of course, the music! Years later, when I was a college student at DePaul, I would again hear that song and the whole experience became a powerful moment of prayer. I again felt Jesus's presence in a real and concrete way, and it was God's presence that uplifted me and filled that which was missing in my life. With this transformative encounter with Christ, I began to pray again, and over time I felt God calling me to return to those Catholic roots. And it was Jesus knocking at the door of my heart that led to my response. I had to respond; I was eager to respond; I wanted to respond. Then in faith, I reconnected with St. Therese (a place I always called home) and entered the RCIA. The rest is history! After becoming Catholic, I discerned a call to the priesthood, entered Mundelein Seminary, and after 6 years of formation was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago on May 19, 2018. And it is now with great joy that I have the privilege of serving the people of St. Gilbert (Grayslake, IL) as their associate pastor.

If you are currently searching, if you have questions about life or faith, that's all normal! And maybe God is also knocking at your door, speaking to your heart, inviting you to explore the Catholic Faith. And I also invite you to trust in the Lord, and to follow your heart. Taking the initial step, that leap of faith can be scary, but be encouraged to know that you have people you can talk to, people who support you, and who have been on a similar journey. I truly believe that God has a marvelous plan for each one of us, and that adventure that Christ lays before us will be unlike any other. #### Respect Life Corner



Over the past year, the Department of Homeland Security's Customs and Border Protection has increasingly chosen to separate children from their parents and legal guardians at the U.S./Mexico border. Since October 2017, over 700 children have been separated from their parents and rendered "unaccompanied," including over 100 children under the age of four. We expect this number to drastically increase with the recent "zero-tolerance" policy.

Many of these immigrant families are fleeing from violence and persecution in their home countries, and seeking safety and protection for their children here in the U.S. While separation can be appropriate when there are trafficking or abuse concerns, more often such separation is occurring in the absence of such justifications. For example, a mother and her 3-year-old son fled from Guatemala to the U.S. to escape persecution by the local gangs. Upon their arrival at the U.S./Mexico border the 3-year-old boy was separated from his mother by Customs and Border Protection (CBP) agents, deemed "unaccompanied," and placed in a separate ORR facility from her. It seems that CBP agents were confused as to the nature of their relationship and believed the boy to be traveling with his aunt. While their parent/child relationship has since been confirmed, the mother continues to be held in an immigrant detention facility. As of today, both mother and toddler have still not been reunited with each other.

Separation from a parent or legal guardian can have extremely adverse effects on children. According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, separating families is extremely frightening and stressful to children, and their research has shown that even short periods of separation can cause psychological trauma and long-term mental health problems.

Catholic Social Teaching underscores the importance of the family and its essential role to the individual and society. When families are ripped apart and children separated from their parents for no reason, something must be done to right this wrong. We must work to ensure that all immigrant families and children who are detained are not needlessly separated from one another and that they are treated with the dignity and respect that they deserve.

#### "JESUS, OUR BREAD" by Sister Caritas

Almost every kind of people has some form of bread in their lives. Many times the kind of bread is determined by the available ingredients and the natural resources of the geographic location. In this area, we grow wheat so our bread is often made of wheat in various forms. There are flour and corn tortes. We have white, rye and wheat bread. For a period of time my mother would make homemade bread. She baked two or four loaves at a time. I would watch as she kneaded the bread and several times would work the dough into loaves until the yeast would make it rise to the level of the pan. Then finally she would bake it and the house would be filled with the most wonderful smell of homemade bread.

The readings today talk about bread of various kinds. We are told of the bread God gave the people in the desert on the journey to the "Promised Land." It was there for them every morning. God responded to their grumbling against Moses and Aaron. He fed his people. God cared for His chosen people.

Jesus had fed the people and they were looking for what they were to do. They were asking Jesus for a sign to prove that He was from God. They were looking for the sign they knew of in the time of Moses, the bread from heaven. Jesus said that He is "the bread of life." We receive this bread that is Jesus, each time we receive Holy Communion. We believe that we receive Jesus. He gives us eternal life. Each time we receive Holy Communion, our faith grows. Our belief in Jesus deepens. We ask Jesus to increase our faith, hope and love. "I am the bread of life," Jesus said. "Whoever comes to me will never hunger. Whoever believes in me will never thirst."
