From the Desk of Fr. Francis

Greetings of Christ's Peace and Joy! Hope you all had a blessed week.

Called to Building up the Kingdom of God

In the last two weekends, we heard Jesus teaching us about the Kingdom of God in parables. Once again in today's Gospel Jesus continues to instruct us about the Kingdom of God by employing more parables. Yes the Kingdom of God is dynamic, is growing, and is our mission now. Our internal openness and experiences of the external attacks can affect its growth. The message is clear and Jesus kindly reminds us that "whoever has ears ought to hear."

Do we take time to hear God's voice in our lives? How do we hear it? As we continue the work on Renew My Church, our new parish has begun the preparatory work of "Building the New Reality." Some of you have volunteered to be part of the team, others are still discerning, and still others who haven't heard about this mission. I want to invite all to be open to and to be involved in this mission. If you are not sure yet, please do not hesitate to speak with me.

The mission of building up God's kingdom belongs to us all as baptized Christians. Just this week on July 20th, the Prefect of the Congregation of Clergy issued a new "Instruction: *The pastoral conversion* of the Parish community in the service of the evangelising mission of the Church." In it, we are reminded that "in the church there is room for all and everyone can find their place' in the one family of God, respecting each person's vocation."

This letter speaks about Pastoral Care, Parish Community, Parish Priest, and the role of Laity. While knowing all baptized are entrusted with Jesus' evangelizing mission, I would like to highlight the texts referring to LAITY below for your reflection.

The Parish community is composed in a particular way of the lay faithful^[127], who, by virtue of their Baptism and the other Sacraments of Christian initiation, and in many cases by matrimony^[128], participate in the evangelising action of the Church, since "the essential vocation and mission of the lay faithful is to strive that earthly realities and all human activity may be transformed by the Gospel"^[129].

In a particular way, the lay faithful, who have a specific secular character, "seek the Kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and by ordering them according to the plan of God" [130]. They "can also feel themselves called, or be called, to work with their pastors in the service of the ecclesial community for its growth and life, by exercising a great variety of ministries according to the grace and charisms which the Lord is pleased to give them" [131]. 86. The lay faithful are called upon in our present age to make a generous commitment to the service of the mission of evangelization, first of all through the general witness of their daily lives, lived in conformity with the Gospel, in whatever environment they are in and at every level of responsibility; in a particular way, they are called to place themselves at the service of the Parish community [132].

Clearly we all have the responsibility of being part of the mission of building up the Kingdom of God. We have to start it with ourselves, our friends, and our neighbors; we have to do so in our families, churches, and workplaces.

Pius XI (1922-1939): Socialism Cannot Be Reconciled with Catholic Doctrine (Encyclical Quadragesimo Anno, May 15, 1931, n. 117); Catholic Socialism is a Contradiction (Ibid. n. 120). Pius XII (1939-1958): The Church Will Fight Socialism to the End ("Radio message to the Katholikentag of Vienna," September 14, 1952 in *Discorsi e Radiomessaggi*, vol. XIV, p. 314); The All-Powerful State Harms True Prosperity (Encyclical Summi Pontificatus, October 20, 1939, n. 60). Faith Witness #3: Special Times Together, Part 1 by Thomas Howard

Can a wedding anniversary witness the peace of Christ? Tom and Llbia Howard think so. For the next two weeks, they share how their Christian marriage is capable of bearing a silent witness of Christ crucified in today's noisy and often turbulent world.

My wife, whose love for me has been consistent, agreed to take an afternoon stroll with me through Ping Tom Park a couple of days before our 33rd wedding anniversary. A few weeks later, during the Alpha online marriage course, we were asked as a couple to reflect on this question: *Tell your partner what has*



been the most special time you have shared together as a couple. Amazingly, we both chose our recent afternoon Ping Tom walk as our special time together, but for very different reasons.

In between the train horn blasts coming from the commuter and commercial rail lines and the strong wake coming in from barges and recreational boaters from the Chicago Sanitary and Ship Canal, two distinct and yet complementary horizons suddenly fused together on one park bench.

My wife's consciousness always seems to be more fixated on temporal rather than theoretical priorities. What most impresses me about her contemplations is how pure they are. Unlike me, Libia tends not to add abstract concepts or theories to how she chooses to describe her journey with Jesus.

What follows represents what was going on in her consciousness while we sat on the park bench together. The flow of our love together was momentarily caught in a snapshot. Zoom into the mind of the female member of a middle-aged couple that found peace in the beauty of God's creation, on a Sunday afternoon, right in the middle of a global pandemic. For one fleeting moment, love wrapped itself into an organic whole. As her head rested on my shoulder, my spouse recalled a scripture reading from our wedding:

Love is patient and kind, It is not jealous and pompous or inflated. It is not rude and does not speak of its own interests. It is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails......So faith, hope, and love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love. 1 Cor 13: 4-7, 13

What made this moment truly special for her was gratitude. In spite of all the ups and downs, misunderstandings, and clarifications, she knows that Jesus remains in the center of our relationship, even after thirty-three years. The snapshot of her head on my shoulder provided a silent testimony to anyone passing by our bench that afternoon in Ping Tom Park. Made in God's image, a Catholic marriage mirrors how love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, and endures all things.

The Kingdom of God by Sr. Caritas

Each of us, as we go through our lives, find things, places and people who become very special to us. Maybe it is something that reminds you of home. Perhaps it is a gift someone gave you that has special meaning. Maybe it is a picture of your Mother or Father. Many events and things in our lives become special. We take special care of them. Today's Gospel places emphasis on the value of the things used in the parable. The treasure was valued enough to sell everything and purchase the field where the treasure was buried. The pearl was so special that the person sold everything and purchased the pearl. The yeast goes through the entire dough. Do you value the kingdom of God so much that you are willing to give up everything? Do you value the Kingdom of God as the person who gave up everything to buy the pearl of great price? Like the yeast, do the values of the Kingdom of God permeate your whole life? Would you give everything for the Kingdom of God?
