# **Seeing Jesus in You and Others**

Last Sunday's readings challenge us to not be afraid when we are doing the works of the Lord. As we resumed our public mass at St. Barbara since March 14<sup>th</sup>, many of you were grateful to return to celebrate the Eucharist in Church. While knowing we are still in the midst of the pandemic and there are a lot of fears among people, we have to continue to implore God's mercy and healing power.

This weekend, as we celebrate the 13<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time, St. Therese Church reopens for public mass. Jesus reminds us, "whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me." This is a particularly demanding message for all Christians now as we face daily violence caused by racial injustice, discrimination, and poverty. This timely message compels us to treat each other as brothers and sisters, and as Jesus in disguise.

I recently came across a post by Susan Nelson who offers 7 practical insights to help others to see Jesus in you. I think they might help us in our own life.

**1.** Know who Jesus is and what he did. Read the Bible to learn more about him. Acts 20:32 says that the Word of God is able to build you up.

2. Love him. Radiate that love with others. Jesus said in John 13:34-35 that people would know us if we had the agape love of God and demonstrate it to the world. Have the right heart. Proverbs 4:23, "Above all things keep your heart for out of it are the issues of life." Proverbs 3:5, "Trust in the Lord with all your Heart and rely not on your own understanding."

**3**. **Care for other people.** Treat others as you would like to be treated (Golden rule of Jesus in Matthew 7:12); think beyond yourself. Jesus forgave Peter even though Peter betrayed Jesus. Peter betrayed Jesus but Jesus would never betray Peter.

**4. Be learned and wise**. Jesus grew in wisdom and stature and favor with both God and Man (Luke 2:52).

5. **Be humble**. After Jesus washed His disciples feet, He said, "An example I have given you, that you should do likewise (John 13:15). Deal with your pride and any boastfulness. Phil 2:5 says, "Let this humble mind be in you that was also in Christ Jesus". Be prepared to say sorry when you get something wrong.

6. Be considerate of others in all that you do. I Corinthians 13:4 says that love is always patient and kind. It was also through love that Jesus healed the sick and His desire was that His followers would do the same thing (Matthew 14:14, Matthew 10:7-8)

7. Watch your tone of voice, your style of language (don't curse, blaspheme, etc.). Always speak kindly of others and try to see things from their perspective. Jesus on the Cross said, "Father forgive them for they know not what they do (Luke 23:34).

Let's continue to pray for the Lord to help us to see Him in each one of us and "to act justly, love tenderly, and walk humbly with our Lord."

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Mother Teresa Parish,

Greetings of Christ's peace to all!

This is a gentle reminder that our parish is certified for Phase II and our volunteers have been trained to help us to resume in person masses. No reservation is needed and registration will take place upon arrival. Our Mass schedule is as follows:

1. St. Barbara Church reopens on the weekend of June 20th and 21st for masses at 5pm vigil, 6am and 9:30am on Sundays.

2. St. Therese Church reopens on Sunday June 28th for masses at 8am and 10:30am. For the 10:30am mass, once the Church reaches its social distancing capacity, people will be asked to attend a livestreamed mass in the Community Room.

3. 8am weekday mass resumes on Monday June 22nd--- Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at St. Therese and Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday at St. Barbara.

While Catholics are still absolved from Sunday obligations, beginning on June 28th, we will livestream our 10:30am Sunday mass via our Facebook and YouTube channel for all who can't join us in person yet.

#### Highlights for Daily and Sunday Mass Guidelines:

#### Preparation

**1.** Greeters should meet the participants outside the church or in the vestibule to ensure all have masks or face coverings, offer hand sanitizer and register participants. They should remind worshippers that anyone who is ill or having symptoms of illness should not enter the church.

**2.** All hymnals, missalettes, loose papers or envelopes are to be taken out of the pews and stored. They may not be used at all until further notice.

**3.** Masks should be worn for the entire time the faithful are in the church. Social distancing must be observed.

# **Celebration of the Liturgy**

1. No congregational singing is allowed at this time. A cantor and accompanist can be used but both must be separated from other ministers and congregants by 10 feet.

**2.** The procession with the gifts is omitted. The gifts are to be on the credence or side table and the priest (or deacon if there is one) can bring them to the altar.

**3.** For the collection there should be no baskets passed, nor should the baskets on the pole be used. Donations should be placed in a designated receptacle that does not move.

**4.** Holy Communion is to be distributed only under the form of the consecrated Host, and only in the hand, with the priest and ministers sanitizing their hands immediately before and immediately after distributing Communion.



#### Procedure for reception of Holy Communion

**a.** Move forward in single file maintaining six feet between each person (look for markers on the floor).

b. Sanitize hands from table or from sanitizer offered by usher. Do not move forward to the priest to receive the Host until you have vigorously rubbed the sanitizer on your hands and the sanitizer has dried on your hands.

**c.** Do NOT touch your face, clothing or any other surface after sanitizing your hands. **d.** As you approach the priest or extraordinary minister, after you have sanitized your hands, receive the Host in your hand ONLY.

**e.** Step six feet to the side, remove strap from one ear of your mask or face covering, and, letting it hang from the other ear and uncovering your mouth, consume the Host. **f.** Replace the mask over your mouth and nose and return to your seat.

#### Procession out of the Church

For the procession out of the church, the participants should be dismissed row by row, allowing for appropriate social distance on the way out.

Your safety is our top priority. Please stay well. You and your loved ones are in my prayers. Please keep me in yours.

# 親愛的教友和朋友們,

歡迎回到3月14日以來第一次公開的主日彌撒!在過去的三個月中,我們所有人都經歷了 很多改變和情緒起伏。未來幾年,大流行的影響將繼續成為我們生活的一部分。現在我 們感謝並希望從此我們能夠親自參與彌撒聖祭。同時,我們知道,在我們接種疫苗之 前,我們仍然面臨著感染病毒的嚴重風險。

當您本週末返回彌撒時,您會注意到我們教堂的變化,並請您遵從大主教府和國家的指引以確保所有人的安全。以下是一些要點,請花一些時間閱讀。

#### 平日和星期日彌撒指引要點:

#### 準備

- 接待員應在教堂外或前廳和參與者會面,以確保所有人都戴著口罩或面罩,提供 消毒搓手液並登記參與者資料。他們應該提醒教友,任何生病或有不適症狀的人 都不應進入教堂。
- 所有的歌書,主日禮儀書,紙張或信封都應從長椅中取出並存放好。它們將不准 使用直至另行通告。
- 3. 教友在教堂的整段時間都應戴口罩並必須注意社交距離。

#### 聖道禮儀

- 目前不允許集體唱歌,祇可以容許領唱員和司琴領唱,但兩者都必須與其他人離開10英尺。
- 由教友負責的奉献禮將被省略。禮品要放在奉獻盤或桌上,神父(或執事,如果 有的話)可以將它帶到祭壇上。
- 收集捐獻時不得用任何籃子,也不得使用長柄收集袋。捐獻應放置在固定的指定 容器中。
- 4. 聖體只能以手領的形式分發,而神父和非常務送聖體員在分發聖體之前和之後要 立即把雙手消毒。

C. 消毒雙手後,請勿觸摸臉部,衣服或任何其他表面。

- D. 在您的雙手進行消毒之後,行前並衹能用手領方式向神父或送聖體員領受 聖體。
- E. 接過聖體後請行到側面六英尺處,將口罩或面罩從一隻耳朵上解下綁帶, 掛在另一隻耳朵上並露出嘴巴,然後吞下聖體。
- F. 然後戴上口罩,遮住口鼻,返回座位上。

步出教堂

彌撒完結並離開教堂時,教友應逐行有序地離開,並保持適當的社交距離。

#### 彌撒後和清潔

- 教會的座席和其他人流量大的地方應使用消毒濕巾清潔,並清除座席上的垃圾和 其他物品。
- 2. 進行清潔的人員必須戴上手套和口罩。
- 在彌撒期間使用過的所有桌子和器皿/儀器必須經過消毒及擦拭乾淨,晾乾後方可 重新使用。請注意,僅用水沖洗不足以殺死病毒。
- 4. 彌撒活動結束後,應對福音/禮儀書進行清潔/擦拭。

# **RESPECT LIFE CORNER**

Sacredness of Life – In our Catholic faith, all human life is sacred by reason of being created in the image and likeness of God. The dignity of this likeness is *shared equally* by each of us and deserves equal respect. This is so regardless of race, color, creed, sex, class or economic status. It defines our relationship with each other. We all are equally precious and equally important. However, as human beings, we all can have biases and prejudices, many of which are inherited, some born from personal history. Too often, consciously or not, our thoughts, words and actions can balk at this equality due to biases of our own or those of the surrounding institutions. Such an implicit or explicit denial of the equal human life dignity can be shared by the king and the convicted felon, by those who publicly witness against racism and those who hijack that witness with violence, by people who profess Catholic orthodoxy as well as those who dissent from it. Today, racism, which denies the sacredness and equality of all human life, remains a leading evil in our country. Black lives do indeed matter; so do brown, yellow and white lives, born and unborn. They all matter equally. Branding as racists those who say so is slanderous. By the same measure, saying insincerely all lives matter as a way to dodge acknowledging and addressing the deep and abiding racism so many "colored" people in our country suffer bespeaks bad faith. By the way, isn't "white" also some kind of color? America has much work to do on the matter of racism. For many, getting at the complexity of the roots of individual and/or institutional racism will require praverful introspection and painful facilitated conversations, and then conversion and action. Despite the pain, let's get to the hard work before all of us; and, while doing so, take care not to inadvertently endorse agenda items of organizations which profess only some black lives matter and ignore that unborn black lives matter too!


