Foundation Celebration by Sr. Caritas

On Oct. 24, 2020 The School Sisters of Notre Dame, Sister Caritas' community of Sisters, celebrated the founding the Congregation of Sisters existing for 187 years. The Sisters are an international Congregation founded in 1833 in Bavaria, Germany. Bishop Michael Whitman and Blessed Teresa Gerhard Inger saw the need to educate girls, young women especially among the poor of the area. A school was begun and soon a community formed to do this very important work. "If you educate the mothers you educate the family." Sisters went to poor communities in the countryside and educated the poor girls. In 1847, Sister Teresa and five other Sisters and a novice, landed in the New York harbor to being work here in the United States. The first school was in St. Mary's, Penn. and soon we founded a school and formation house in Baltimore. The Bishops asked us also to teach boys. We needed to change our constitution to adapt to the new ministry.

In the area of our parishes, the School Sisters of Notre Dame started and taught in Santa Lucia and In St. Maria Incoronata. The congregation spread throughout the United States and Canada. Missions in Africa, South American, Guam were started. The latest convent of Sisters began in South Sudan a month or two ago with four Sisters. Celebrate with us and continue to pray for vocations.

Wisdom, Key to the Kingdom of God

It was a long time of waiting. Finally, it was time. The wise women had extra oil and could join the party. The others had to buy extra oil and missed the possibility of going to the place of celebration. The kingdom of God is like that and to enter it we must be prepared. We must have the wisdom to be ready for the coming of the Lord. Underlying wise decisions leading to the kingdom is the THIRSTING for God which helps us to make good decisions. As the first reading says, wisdom sits at the gate of those who seek wisdom. Wisdom is there for you, too.
