A Journey of Conversion

Once again we find ourselves in this Lenten season of penance and hope. The ashes we received on Ash Wednesday remind us of our call to "repent and believe in the Good News." We do so especially by prayers, fasting and alms giving.

Pope Francis in his 2021 Lenten message invites all Christians to *renew our faith, hope and charity during the Lent amid this pandemic. Faith* calls us to believe that Jesus is the truth, and we are the bearers of the truth. *Hope* invites us to be reconciled with our God and to be hope for others. Pope Francis explained that in order to give hope to others, it is sometimes enough simply to be kind, to be "willing to set everything else aside in order to show interest, to give the gift of a smile, to speak a word of encouragement, to listen amid general indifference" (*Fratelli Tutti*, 224). *Charity* refocuses us to the needs of others.

Our faith, hope and love can be stronger through our Lenten spiritual exercises, namely prayer, fasting and charitable work. The following insights from Pope Francis on each of these three dimensions can be helpful to us.

Through recollection and silent prayer, hope is given to us as inspiration and interior light, illuminating the challenges and choices we face in our mission. Hence the need to pray (cf. Mt 6:6) and, in secret, to encounter the Father of tender love.

Fasting helps us to love God and our neighbor, inasmuch as love, as Saint Thomas Aquinas teaches, is a movement outwards that focuses our attention on others and considers them as one with ourselves (cf. *Fratelli Tutti*, 93).

Love rejoices in seeing others grow. Hence it suffers when others are anguished, lonely, sick, homeless, despised or in need. Love is a leap of the heart; it brings us out of ourselves and creates bonds of sharing and communion.

Lent is a journey of conversion and it leads us to renewed life, hope and love. Let's take this season seriously for the good of our spiritual life as well of our brothers and sisters.

- All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat for Catholics over 14.
- Ash Wednesday (Feb. 17) and Good Friday (April 2) are days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. Fasting means taking only one full meal and two smaller meals that, taken together, do not equal one full meal.
- Throughout Lent, Catholics are especially encouraged to perform voluntary acts of penance.

One Having Authority (3) --- Fr. John Cuff

Each year on the first Sunday of Lent, the Gospel speaks of Christ's being tempted by the Devil. It happens immediately after his baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan. No sooner has Jesus received a mission at His Baptism than He's stumbling around in the desert alone, with the Devil as His wily companion. So no one of us is immune, not even Jesus. As the poet said: "First heaven opened up and God smiled, then hell opened up and Satan laughed." It's strangely fascinating, and somewhat comforting, to see that this happens to the Son of God. He is truly divinity in the flesh – yet He wasn't isolated and immunized from the real world. Which means that His being tempted gives us real hope and strength, that He is truly one of us.

In today's Gospel there is nothing accidental in Jesus' encounter with the Devil. The Spirit of God led the Son of God into the desert. This was an event that had to happen. As it unfolds we need to understand two things. Firstly, the desert was a place away from people. The Son of God was alone in His temptations. He had no help, no support, no encouragement from family or friends. Satan had Him one on one. Secondly, the terrible hunger which resulted from a forty-day fast left the Son of God at His weakest point. Famished and alone, the Son of God faced his greatest trial. It was all part of God's plan. This test of Jesus' will had to take place at His weakest moment. If He withstood the test, He would be able to withstand all other tests. It had to be this way and God could not protect His Son from these trials.

As we see Jesus being tempted in this way, we're shocked by the brazenness of the devil. If Satan is brazen enough to tempt even the Son of God, then we can be sure that he will have no hesitation in tempting us. Every follower of Christ will face temptation – and Satan will make sure that the temptation arises when we are at our greatest vulnerability. Like the story of the young man who became a Christian on Sunday and lost his job the following week; which resulted in the statement that he was not coming back to church because God had let him down. That's an example of Satan catching us when we are most vulnerable.

To think Satan will spare us is a mistake. We're all in a war between good and evil. Satan knows no mercy; but beware, sadly he does take prisoners. But every soldier has the duty to escape capture and return to the battle. The Devil will attack us when we're alone and vulnerable and tempt us. So this Lent let's outsmart him. Let's plan a Lenten strategy to remain on our guard, by knowing well our weak points, strengthening our defenses, and being ready for action. Only when we can finally say with Jesus "Begone, Satan!" will we be victorious and the enemy vanguished.

Lifetime Promises by Sr. Caritas

Family live is based on the promise between husband and wife. As children grow they also make childlike promises which they do not keep. When they are more mature, they make serious promises which they keep unless they respond to peer pressure. When we are baptized, our parents and sponsors make promises in our name. They promise to help us live out God's promise to us, making us we are children of God.

The First reading today we hear the story of God making a promise symbolized by the rainbow, that the world would never again be destroyed by floods. It is the sign of His Covenant with His people. In the Gospel, Jesus comes into Galilee after John is imprisoned. He reminds those who are listening that now is the "time of fulfillment." It is the time of the fulfillment of God's promise of a Savior.

This is the First Sunday of Lent. Jesus tells us the basic underneath them of this season. "Repent and believe the good news." Ultimately it is the way of living up to our baptismal promises. Repentance calls us to reflect on how we live our lives. "What do we need to change in our lives to be more faithful to our Baptismal promises?" The changes in our lives are made so we can fulfill the second part of what Jesus said, "Believe in the Good News." We have about forty days to do these two things, "Repent and Believe in the Good News." Each of us is responsible to live up to our promises at Baptism. How will you fulfill those promises? How will you live out your gift of being made in the image and likeness of God? Listen today. "Repent and believe in the Good News."
